NZ, 1907 onwards, 60 mins, archival compilation, Exempt A fascinating and often hilarious collection of NZ and international cycling movies, home-made and professional, from the archive of Ngā Taonga Sound & Vision.

Rising from the Ashes

US, 2013 (82 mins), documentary, Exempt A rag tag group form Rwanda's first cycling team, overcoming their traumatic national past in a bid to make history at the Tour De France and 2012 Olympics.

Contromano / Bike Repair Shop

Italy, 2014, 73 mins, documentary, Exempt As Turin emerges from an era of cars, two very different bicycle repair shop owners ride the city's new interest in cycling, transforming their own and others' lives.

International, 92 mins, compilation, Exempt
Bike films that celebrate, encourage and inspire females
who love to bike. Bring your best friend, your boyfriend or
hey, bring your bike!

Ladri di biciclette / The Bicycle Thief

Italy, 1948, 89 mins, feature film, PG

In post-war Italy, a man and his son frantically seek the stolen bicycle that means the difference between work and poverty. Voted one of the greatest films of all time.

International, 145 mins, compilation, Exempt 2017's bike-alicious new collection of the best all-cycling-genre short films from around the world, chosen for Kiwis. Includes the story of NZ's Old Ghost Road and more.

Ovarian Psycos

US, 2016, 72 mins, documentary, Exempt

A ferocious and unapologetic crowd of cycling women have become a visible force in Los Angeles, confronting violence, reclaiming safer neighbourhoods for women.

Mama Agatha

Netherlands, 2015, 16 mins, documentary, Exempt Migrant women in Amsterdam find their way into their new society, learning to cycle with 'Mama Agatha', a 59-year-old Ghanaian woman with the spirit of a 20-year-old.
